“ One at the time..all the good ones are leaving us....but their memories will remain with us....It was March 1955..and together with my parents and brothers we arrived in Columbus..also Holocaust survivors..My parents Peysach and Chana Epelbaum also came from Poland and I was born in Milano ,Italy....I believe that my parents met them at Agudas Achim..or perhaps at Martin's...my earliest recollection of them..was when we were in their house..near James Rd..they all spoke Polish and Jiddish..I also spoke Jiddish..As time went by....we were in the house often....I recall also going to the Swimming Pool (Glengary??)on Westerville Rd,I believe...they were very nice people,friendly and helpful..we didn't have a car at the time..so I think that your dad gave us rides....If I recall correctly they both met at the Concentration Camp..after the Liberation.... I believe.....We were all "greenes" and I believe that he used to work at Schottenstein's on Parsons Ave..selling mens clothing...I would see them both in Schull for many years..I The most important thing that your father did for me .. was teaching me how to drive an American Car and helping me to obtain a driver's license...well,he must have done a very good job teaching me,because I 4 years later at age22,I left Lazarus and Schottenstein's and spent the next 35 years,plus, traveling the US (sales,marketing and much more)...I don,t recall meeting any of you,during the years that went by...few times during the week I attend Morning Minyan.. Perhaps we shall meet one of these days.....I live near Mt Carmel East..... With my most sincere Condolences for your loss Knowing them both was indeed a memory that will remain with me forever.
